

**MINUTES**  
**OHIO LIONS DISTRICT 13-C**  
**THURSDAY – JUNE 5, 2008**  
**Dino's Restaurant – Willoughby, OH**

**CALL TO ORDER:** District Governor Lion Maggie Dellmore called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** Led by Governor Lion Maggie Dellmore.

**INVOCATION:** Given by Lions Jim Klages.

**PROTOCOL:** Lion John Tigue established protocol.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

Cabinet Secretary Lion Mary Chentnik noted that minutes of the last Cabinet Meeting of February 21, 2008 and the Annual Convention Business Meeting Minutes of April 5, 2008 were available on the website and at this meeting and everyone had an opportunity to review these minutes. She also noted that she is working with the Zone Chairs to get the PU-101's in. There are twelve Clubs that have not yet submitted their reports. District Governor Lion Maggie Dellmore asked if there were any changes to either sets of these minutes. Lion John Tigue noted one change, one on page 4 of the Convention Business Meeting Minutes which should note that PDG Grant Frazer is a "he" and not a "she" in the 9<sup>th</sup> paragraph. PDG Lion Tommy Thompson made a motion to approve both sets of minutes with the above noted change, seconded by PDG Lion Carol Lester. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:**

IPDG Lion Ken Marshall presented the financial reports for the District as well as the Convention. He noted that not all of the receipts have been turned in at this time. Lion John Tigue asked about the reserve fund of \$2,500 and it was noted to be shown on the report. The Convention at this time made a profit of \$435.45. A motion was made by PDG Lion Carol Lester to approve the Financial Reports as presented, seconded by Lion Cindy Palmentera. Motion carried.

**VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S COMMENTS:**

District Governor Elect Dona Klages thanked District Governor Maggie for a wonderful year. She noted that time flies when you are having fun and she is packed and ready to leave for the International Convention.

She thanked everyone for their support and noted that next year we will get to meet Helen Keller and this should be very entertaining for everyone.

It was also noted that Lions International has approved the use of paid extension people and training. She noted that there will be a team of 12 and areas that need support for Clubs will be identified. Those certified Guiding Lions will also be utilized and the extension team will sponsor new clubs. On September 1<sup>st</sup> the International Team will come to train and present workshops.

**DISTRICT GOVERNOR'S COMMENTS:**

District Governor Lion Maggie Dellmore discussed the re-districting and noted that at the State Convention a straw vote was conducted. It was noted that Map #1 merges the 10 districts into 5 districts and that was recognized as the most likely scenario. There will be another vote at the District Conventions and then this will go forward.

District Governor Lion Maggie Dellmore also thanked everyone for their support all year and for all they do for Lionism.

**ZONE CHAIRMAN REPORTS:**

**ZONE 1:** Lion Ken Powell was unable to attend, but he did call.

**ZONE 2:** Lion Chuck Barton noted that there will be a joint installation dinner on June 17<sup>th</sup>, hosted by Willoughby Evening. All eight clubs are invited to attend. Updates on the various clubs were presented and he noted that Euclid is having their 300 Club Evening. Highland Heights is having a Hole in One Contest every Saturday and Sunday in August. North Coast is having a Three-Digit Raffle. Willoughby has an event coming up a week from Sunday from 7:00 to 1:30. Willoughby Evening is having their pasta dinners. Willoughby Hills is sponsoring “Run for the Hills” event at the Community Days on June 28<sup>th</sup>.

**ZONE 3:** Lion Jim Klages reported that his Zone is focusing on getting members and moving forward. Bedford will be working the annual carnival.

**ZONE 4:** Lion Mary Chentnik thanked all of her Clubs for a great year. She noted that all of the Zone 4 Clubs have submitted their PU-101’s on time. Brook Park is still working on membership. Garfield Heights just inducted four new members at their last meeting and had invited her to attend. Their new Club President, Carmen Iammarino was introduced to the members present. The Garfield Heights Lions Club now meets at a new location “Tweeties” in Garfield Heights. They also have a Golf Outing planned for June 27<sup>th</sup> at Chippewa Golf Club. Information is available on the table. They also recently lost one of their long time members, Lion Lucian Przybysz. North Royalton had their Flag Dedication on Memorial Day, an article appeared in the paper about the Memorial, and a copy is available on the table. They also have an upcoming Golf Outing at Cherokee Hills on July 23<sup>rd</sup>. Strongsville is going to be at the Strongsville Rib Fest on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. They will be running an ice cream tent.
