An Inspiring Lion

Leo's Clubs members are the young Lions Club members of tomorrow. Handled with care, these inspiring minds of youth can be motivated to becoming Lions for the rest of their lives. A perfect example of protecting the legacy of Lions, through the youth of tomorrow, is Lion Tina Dickenson of the Brook Park Lions Club.

Lion Tina, shortly after becoming a Lions member in March of 2004, took on the responsibility of watching over the Brook Park Leo's Club and their club activities. One of the Leo's Club activities was a sponsored theme dance, once a month, for the youth of the Brook Park community. Under Lion Tina's direction and supervision the Leo's club led the theme dance to become the number one fundraiser of the Lions Club of Brook Park.

The theme dance is open to community youths between the ages of 9 to 14. The cost to attend the dance is \$5.00 per person and if a youth brought a can of food to the dance to donate to the Reach Hunger Center they received a \$1.00 off their admission. Held in the Brook Park Recreational Center

they serve 175 to 200 youths of their community with their theme dance. Arrangements were made to use the Recreational Center facility for free. The donated food is given to the Reach Hunger Center through the use of the Dickenson family car.

Lion Tina advertises the theme dance through the Recreation Center and puts the flyers together. Lion Tina makes a list of duties for each Leo's member to perform while at the dance with set time limits. Providing shifts for them to get the work done and after a Leo's performed their shift work they can have time for themselves at the dance for some fun. King Lion Amanda Konery stated; "she doesn't realize how much I appreciate her, she works so well with the Leo's and she handles the kids so well at the dance".

Lion Tina has made this dance a family effort. Her daughter Kristen (age 16) is the Brook Park Leo's Club President and her son Devin (age 14) is the Leo's Club Treasurer. Her husband Lion Bill, Treasurer of the Brook Park Lions Club, helps chaperone the theme

dance often helping out by taking some of the kids home when parents were unable to pick their kids up. Although unable to attend most of the theme dances is Lion Tina's daughter Amanda (age18) who is off in college. But I am sure if she were home she would help too.

Lion Tina works full time with a job that often sends her off on business. Yet she still finds the time get things in order for the Leo's Club. Lion Mary Marek, Secretary of the Brook Park Lions said, "She has done a remarkable job and a dedicated job to the teens and youngsters. I admire her dedication to the group and think that is why the Leo's have been so successful". The Leo's do more than just the theme dance.

The Leo's recently had a fundraiser for a cancer stricken youth by the name of Nicholas Luca. At the Annual Pancake Breakfast for the Lions Club the Leo's sold craft's and sponsored the entire January theme dance in honor of the youth. They presented Nicholas with their entire earning just a week before his death. Lion Tina's guidance and the Leo have made it all possible for this presentation.

Shaping the minds of the leaders of tomorrow with integrity, brilliance, and passion is what Lion Tina is all about. Supporting the Leo's with a direction in which I am sure the kids will remember for most of their lives. That is what makes Lion Tina Dickenson truly an inspiring Lion.

District Governor's Comments...

We have turned the corner and our planning for next year. It's hard to imagine the year is almost over. It has been a lot of fun so far and I know the best is yet to come! I have been told over a 10-year period a club should be bringing in 7-8% new members each year for our clubs to remain at the same level as they are today. We have all been working on membership and we need to continue, in order that our district continues. Club Presidents I ask that you include in your next board meeting the club officers address the issue of membership and develop a plan to recruit new members. We want to bring in new members, people that are service minded and willing to help. I am confident we all know someone like that. I would like to see our clubs try to offset the number of drops. Lets continue to work on bringing in new members. Together we can do it; together we can make a difference.

Deputy District Governor Lion Ken's Comments

One thing every club needs to do is occasionally review their dues structure to make sure they aren't losing money. Losing money you say? Well, yes, and it's a good bet there are a number of clubs in 13-C who are subsidizing their members.

Do you *really* know how much the current dues are, and how they are going to change in the near future? Here's the answer (annual basis):

International:	\$33.20
District + State:	\$13.00
Total	\$46.20

On July 1, 2005, the Lions International dues will increase to \$39.00 per year, which will bring the total bill to \$52.00. So, come July 1st, if your club dues are less than \$52 you are subsidizing your members.

If you have a money tree that delivers a pile of bucks each year, or you simply don't care, you're in good shape.

A CLUB'S STRUCTURE**
Presented by Lion Marty Dennis, Zone 5 Chairman

While preparing the following information for this month's newsletter, I was reminded of a few important factors that help to build a successful club - **LEADERSHIP** and

FELLOWSHIP – without them, a club simply exists.

The following “**LEADERS**” constitutes the cement in constructing such a club:

President/King Lion
Immediate Past President
Vice Presidents
Secretary
Treasurer
Lion Tamer
Tail Twister
Membership Director
Board of Directors
Committees

...while the club’s members are the bricks to keep the club alive!

The factor of “**FELLOWSHIP**” should be apparent at each club meeting:

- a) to learn more from each other and respect each other,
- b) to understand the club’s goals,
- c) to make important club decisions, and
- d) to promote Lionism to others at all times.

THE PRESIDENT/KING LION

Presides at all club meetings; appoints committees; motivates his/her club; and attends zone and district meetings.

At the beginning of the year: he/she sets goals; committees are formed, he/she meets their Zone Chairman; is aware of record keeping forms (Monthly Membership Report # C-23-A, Annual Activities Report

#A-1, Club Officer Report Form #PU-101, Supply Order Form); and becomes aware of the club’s fiscal responsibilities.

Communicate – both effectively and constantly with your club members, the Zone Chairman, the district, and your community.

VICE PRESIDENTS

Helps to assist in shaping and executing the policies of the club; act for the president in his/her absence; and assign committees that function under his/her leadership.

(To learn more, attend the Leadership Training on 4/16/05)

SECRETARY

An important liaison between his/her club, the District Governor and Lions Club International. Provides all communications to the club; and is responsible for monthly reports (Monthly Membership, club records, minutes, and attendance). He/she is a member of the Governor’s Advisory Committee and is expected to attend all zone meetings.

(To learn more, make a reservation to attend the April 16th Leadership Training.)

TREASURER

The custodian of all club funds! He/she is to deposit

all monies and disburse only upon direction from the Board of Directors. He/she is to assist in the preparation of the club’s budget and prepare financial statements. (More to follow at the April 16’s Leadership Training.)

TAIL TWISTER

This officer maintains harmony and provides good fellowship at each club meeting/function. He/she can impose and collect reasonable fines to create a unity of fun.

(Learn about the fun at our District’s Leadership Day).

LION TAMER

Is another important Lions club member who maintains the club’s property of their country’s flag, their banner, and their gong and gavel. He/she assures these items are available and visible at all times. But most important, he/she assists in greeting guests and prospective new members. (It’s all at the Leadership Training!)

DIRECTORS

These club officers assist in shaping and executing policies of the club. They should attend all regular and special meetings to provide valuable input and decision-making.

(A continental breakfast, lunch, keynote speaker, and training sessions are all FREE on Saturday, April 16th).

The Convention Corner

WHAT THE INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR MEANS TO A CONVENTION

It is important for the International Director to attend and participate in District Conventions. The International Director (ID) is a member of the Board of Directors of the Lions International family. This gives the ID the knowledge of what is currently happening at Lions International and what direction the International Association is planning to take in the future. The ID will also bring with them a personal message from the International President. More importantly, he will help the District Governor with any issues that may be occurring in the district.

If there is a Board Meeting taking place or a currently seated International Director is not available the weekend of the district convention, a Past International Director (PID) will be invited to attend. The District Governor has the opportunity to select the ID or PID that will speak at the convention during the year the DG holds office. This year there is an International Board meeting the weekend of District 13-C's convention. PID Lion Buster Hall was invited at the request of DG Lion Carol. This process typically occurs 1-2 years in advance of the convention.

International Directors will also make themselves available to any Lion member who has questions about the international organization or is interested in taking the next step on a district or international level. They will

provide information about what steps need to be taken in order to pursue their goals. The ID's presence gives the local Lions insight into Lions International, bringing them closer to the international picture.

We hope that the ID's presence will encourage more people to accept positions outside of their club on a District, State or International level.

Be sure to participate in the Saturday (April 2, 2005) seminar where you will have the opportunity to speak with PID Lion Buster Hall.

OHIO LIONS FOUNDATION

Founded in 1985, the Ohio Lions Foundation (OLF) has been aiding Ohio Lions and their communities. ALL of the donations to OLF stay in Ohio. It is Ohio Lions helping Ohioans when the need is there.

As a member of a Lions Club, you are automatically a member of OLF. Your generous support over the last 19+ years has enabled OLF to make significant grants in excess of \$900,000.

OLF is proud of its record of responding quickly with disaster relief grants for food, clothing, blankets, temporary shelter, home heating fuel, medical expenses, eyeglasses, and sanitation supplies for

victims of floods, tornadoes, ice storms, fires and other disasters. This year we had terrible flooding in southern Ohio and OLF responded with flood relief grants for food, medical, and clothing for the Marietta, Belpre, Lisbon, Dover, Adena and other communities. Since the Foundation's founding more than \$120,000 has been awarded in disaster relief throughout Ohio.

In addition to disaster relief, OLF has awarded 10 *Helen Keller Scholarships* annually in the amount of \$2750 to visually impaired students at 5 Ohio universities. This is one of the very few scholarship programs available to visually impaired post-graduate students. To date over \$261,000 has been awarded to student in nearly every academic field.

Three years ago, OLF initiated a matching grant program with the goal of placing low vision readers in public libraries throughout Ohio. Expanded this year to include community based public senior centers, a total of 43 readers matching grants have been awarded in the amount approximately \$50,000.

Also over \$69,000 has been awarded for capital grants to various sight related, educational and civic organizations for the acquisition of various equipment, including a speech assisted PC, a C.C.T.V., a Braille printer, a tape transcribing machine, a vision van, and an automatic defibrillator.

OLF has also awarded program grants of over \$117,000 to support various sight and diabetes related programs. These include OLF Pre-School Vision Screening, the American Diabetes Assoc. Mobile Outreach Unit, the printing of Tactic Magazine and the Ohio State School for the Blind.

As OLF runs entirely on donations, your continued support is needed so that your Ohio Lions Foundation may be maintained and expanded. All donations to OLF are tax deductible for individual Lion members, friends, and community business donations.

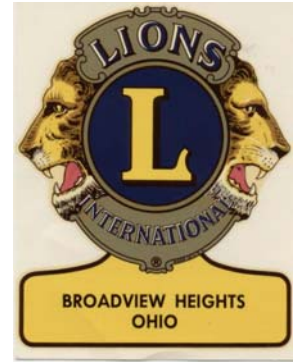

Broadview Hts – Brecksville Residents Sought as Potential Life-Saving Donors



National Marrow Donor Program, American Red Cross and Broadview Hts Lions Club are joining forces to help local family

Each year, more than 30,000 people are diagnosed with life-threatening blood diseases such as leukemia and aplastic anemia, as well as certain immune system and genetic disorders. To survive, many of these patients need someone to donate healthy marrow or blood stem cells for their life-saving transplant. A transplant is possible only when the patient and donor have matching tissue types. Seventy percent of patients are unable to find a matched donor within their immediate family and must search the National Marrow Donor Program (NMDP) Registry. Brecksville and Broadview Hts residents now have the opportunity to help a local family in need. The Broadview Hts Lions Club is sponsoring a volunteer donor recruitment drive to be held on Sunday January 30th at Brecksville's Christ the Redeemer Church at 9201 Brecksville Rd from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm.

The first step to becoming a committed donor is to join the NMDP Registry. Volunteers must be between the ages of 18 to 60 and in good health. After completing a brief health questionnaire, each person will give a small sample of blood and sign a consent form. Each initial typing costs \$25.00. To encourage participation in the drive, the Lions Club will pay the full fee for the first 20 participants.

The Broadview Lions Club helps people around the world and around the corner. Operating the Bloodview Haunted House has allowed the Lion Club to donate over a million dollars to various charities and causes.

Diana Fox, the daughter-in-law of Terri Fox of Avery Rd, is suffering from acute leukemia. The NMDP Registry has located a possible match for Diana, but the search continues for a better match.

The National Marrow Donor Program is committed to its global mission to extend and improve life through innovative stem cell therapies. Through its extensive U.S. and international Network, the NMDP maintains the world's largest, most diverse Registry of more than 5 million volunteer blood stem donors; provides resources for patients and physicians; and conducts research to improve the outcomes of stem cell transplants.

If you are unable to make the January 30th screening at Brecksville's Christ the Redeemer Church, a second drive will be held at Assumption Church at 9183 Broadview Rd, Broadview Hts on Monday February 28th.
