## AN INSPIRING LION

Lion Kevin Barrett is a member of the Broadview Heights Lions Club, and has been so since 1998. He earned his bachelor's degree from Cleveland State University in political science. He currently works for the United States Department of Defense Finance and Accounting Services in the Federal Building in downtown Cleveland. Lion Kevin has held many positions in his club including that of President in 2003. He has received a wide collection of honors from the Lions of District 13C including an International Presidents Leadership Award in 2004. Only a select few have received this award. Lion Kevin also has been presented with the Ohio Lions Eye Research Foundation, Founders Award. He is one of only five recipients of this prestigious award in Ohio.

Just one more thing, Lion Kevin has been legally blind since birth from a congenital eye disorder. He certainly gives new meaning to the word determination.

We, as Lions, serve our communities to fight sight a

ailments worldwide. It hits a little closer to home when one of our fellow Lions members can give us a first hand account of blindness. Lion Kevin Barrett, in a Sun Courier News article titled "Barrett Helps Open Eyes to Challenges of the Blind" published in February of 2003 by Mary Davies, stated, "I've been able to sensitize (club members) to what our specific needs are". This press release helped Lion Kevin to promote Lions and his other passion, BEEP Baseball.

Lion Kevin has always been an athlete. He competed in national sports competitions for blind athletes since the mid seventies. This is where Lion Kevin and a few of his friends learned about a baseball

program for the blind. This sport was just starting to get recognition when Lion Kevin and his friends decided to help the sport along in 1984 by founding their own non-profit BEEP Baseball Team for the blind right here in Cleveland.

The team Lion Kevin and his friends started was named the Cleveland Scrappers. Lion Kevin is the pitcher the team. Lion Linda, his wife of 20years, said BEEP Baseball, “makes him feel that he can contribute and feel more like a sighted person with more self-worth.” The pitcher in BEEP Baseball team has to be the most precise athlete on the team. The pitcher must know their teammates swing patterns, and throw the ball in a precise manner to get hits. The ball beeps as it comes near the hitter and the bases beep, too. However, Lion Kevin is most proud of his involvement with BEEP Baseball when Cleveland became the sight for the 2001 and 2006 World Series of BEEP Baseball in Strongsville. Last year, the Scrappers finished fourth of 16 teams.

Lion District Governor Ken Marshall stated, “Lion Kevin is, dedicated, hardworking, and self-motivated person” and he is amazed by Lion Kevin’s many accomplishments. Lion Kevin Barrett has been a Lions member for 10 years. However, his performance, determination, and work with the blind have been momentous and that is what makes Lion Kevin Barrett truly an inspiring Lion.

Founded in 1985, the Ohio Lions Foundation (OLF) has been aiding Ohio Lions and their communities. ALL of the donations to OLF stay in Ohio. It is Ohio Lions helping Ohioans when the need is there.

As a member of a Lions Club, you are automatically a member of OLF. Your generous support over the last 20 years has enabled OLF to make significant grants in excess of \$1000,000.

OLF is proud of its record of responding quickly with disaster relief grants for food, clothing, blankets, temporary shelter, home heating fuel, medical expenses, eyeglasses, and sanitation supplies for victims of floods, tornadoes, ice storms, fires and other disasters. This year we had terrible flooding in southern Ohio and OLF responded with flood relief grants for food, medical, and clothing for the Marietta,

Belpre, Lisbon, Dover, Adena and other communities. Since the Foundation's founding more than \$150,000 has been awarded in disaster relief throughout Ohio.

In addition to disaster relief, OLF has awarded 11 *Helen Keller Scholarships* annually in the amount of \$2750 to visually impaired students at 5 Ohio universities. This is one of the very few scholarship programs available to visually impaired post-graduate students. To date over \$292,000 has been awarded to student in nearly every academic field.

Three years ago, OLF initiated a matching grant program with the goal of placing low vision readers in public libraries throughout Ohio. Expanded this year to include community based public senior centers, a total of 48 readers matching grants have been awarded in the amount approximately \$60,000 including North Royalton and Tallmadge.

Also over \$82,000 has been awarded for capital grants to various sight related, educational and civic organizations for the acquisition of various equipment, including a speech assisted PC, a C.C.T.V., a Braille printer, a tape-transcribing machine, a vision van, and an automatic defibrillator.

OLF has also awarded program grants of over \$122,000 to support various sight and diabetes related programs. These include OLF Pre-School Vision Screening, the American

Diabetes Assoc. Mobile Outreach Unit, the printing of Tactic Magazine and the Ohio State School for the Blind.

As OLF runs entirely on donations, your continued support is needed so that your Ohio Lions Foundation may be maintained and expanded. All donations to OLF are tax deductible for individual Lion members, friends, and community business donations.

## **WHAT DOES THE LIONS CHARTER MEAN?**

Each Lions club has a document, which gives the members of the club the right to use the Lions name and logo while conducting business as a civic and social entity. This document is the charter and gives the members of the club

permission to use the Lions logo and name while conducting their civic and social activities. The Charter is the club's right to exist.

In exchange for the right to use the Lions logo and name, the club is required to remit dues to the International Association of Lions Clubs (LCI) and abide by all rules and regulations of LCI at the time of chartering and any rules and regulations enacted subsequent to the date of chartering.

Chartering also establishes the club as a tax-exempt civic and social welfare organization, 501©(4) under group exemption Number 0239. LCI has set procedures by which a club may choose to become a charitable organization 501©(3) organization and has set itself as an example of how the process is done. The club must retain its original chartered name and 501©(4) status, but may establish a foundation, and request a determination letter for the Internal Revenue Service, granting the foundation charitable status. The request to become a charitable entity is expensive (\$750) and requires the filing of a form 1023, which is a twelve to fifteen page document.

The most severe penalty LCI can impose upon a deficient or problem Lions club is cancellation of the club's charter. If this occurs, the club may no longer use the Lions name or Lions logo in any of its current or future activities.

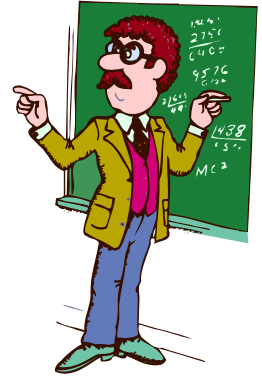
