### District Governor's Report

At the State Convention, two issues were very important to every Lion. First was the election of Steven Sherer for 2nd Vice President of Lions Clubs International. It is my pleasure to write that it was unanimous! The second was the Ohio Lions dues increase winning by a large margin. MD 13 constitution, article, State revenue section 3 and 4e section 3:  
State revenue and funds the revenue received under sections 1 and 2 of article v1 shall be distributed as follows;  
a. State Council Fund:  
beginning July 1, 2010 it shall be four dollars and sixty-six

cents (\$4.66) of the annual per capita tax. After July 1, 2013, it shall be four dollars and sixteen cents (\$4.16) of the annual per capita tax.

b. State Operation Fund:

beginning July 1, 2010 it shall be five dollars and seventy cents

(\$5.70) of the annual per capita tax .After July 1, 2013 it shall be six dollars and twenty cents (\$6.20) of the per capita tax.

c. International Convention:

fifty two cents (\$.52) of the annual per capita tax

d. Restricted Fund: one dollar and twenty eight cents(\$1.28) of the annual per capita tax.

Our District also had the pleasure of voting for 2nd VDG Lion Dan Lester.

We know he will do well PDG Lion Mrs. HO is now WO, and Lion Carol will be a big help.

Lion Ray Dellmore is now the chair for the Sight And Hearing; we can't do better.

I would like very much to thank the Lions of District 13C for letting me serve as Governor for the past year. It has been a successful year, working with many old and new friends. Thank you once again!

7. What you would like to know about Lions and how can we assist you in making your Club better, stronger, happier, more meaningful, helpful, or whatever you think you would like to do?

I may add some other questions to this, but I hope this will get you thinking.

### **Membership Chairman Report**

#### **MEMBERSHIP MOMENTS**

I thought I would share a little about my visitations to Bonita Springs Lions Club in Florida. The 134+ members meet for two dinners and one board meeting each month. Eighty+ members attend the dinners. The membership is divided into committees: EYE CLINIC, PANCAKE BREAKFAST, PRODUCE FLEA MARKETS, AND THE THRIFT STORE. I am sure there are other committees, but these chairpersons and committee members were recognized at the dinner we attended.

The Thrift Store is a combination of about 4 small buildings, very organized and opened and manned by volunteers six days a week; and netted \$54,000 in February alone. The donations are picked up in two large van trucks proudly displaying the Lions Logo, brought to a processing room, and then sorted and made ready for sale.

The Eye Clinic is a separate building where 10-12 volunteer doctors (one retina specialist) assist the Lions in a complete vision screening. Between Dec 2007 and June 2009 1,800 patients were seen. Two doctors sign up for the same

day once per month, and the appointments are scheduled accordingly. After the intake papers are completed (with assistance of interpreter), they are screened for distance, peripheral and refractory before seeing the doctor. The languages are definitely a barrier, but the Lion volunteers seem to manage. Everyone is accepted for screening, but referred to their local Lions Club for the glasses if they are from another Lion area. Surgeries are performed at discounts as Lion Elaine has made some good contacts during her 11 years as chairperson.

The Pancake Committee serves every weekend from January through April; average attendance is 300 per week. The Produce Farm Markets are held Wednesdays and Saturdays year long.

The Club is very healthy financially: giving two grants the evening we were there-- \$3,000 to Jamaica Outreach and \$3,000 to Special Needs Bowling group. Five \$8,000 scholarships are given annually and maintained throughout the 4 years of college attendance. They also have a 24 member Leo's Club who help at pancake breakfasts.

Next month I will share the time Lion Dave and I attended a district screening.

## **GALEP Report**

GALEP held its board meeting at Tallmadge Hall June 7, 2010 with about 15 persons in attendance.

Since January 1, 2010, Galep has approved 30 applications and paid for 25 prescription eyeglasses and 10 eye examinations. Since its reorganization GALEP has approved over 94 applications. GALEP has \$109,205 at May 31, 2010.

Lion James Lostetter announced the deaths of Dr. Dan Mathias, long time member of GALEP and Lion Chuck Garn, also long time member of GALEP.

Discussion of the revised Code of Regulations and Bylaws was discussed and several suggestions made concerning voting rights of officers and directors versus clubs. Decided to leave voting rights with officers and directors for now, but consider amending the bylaws later to give voting rights to clubs in order to get more club participation.

Lions Ray Dellmore has met with Prevent Blindness Ohio to discuss ways which the two organizations may coordinate their efforts to help those persons needing eye care. Darcy Downie of Prevent Blindness is scheduled to make a presentation at a GALEP board meeting either in August or October.

It is the policy of GALEP to pay for eye exams for children

which cost \$30. Adults are referred to Summa for eye exams or if the applicant prefers, they may go to Dr. Thomas Adams of Osman Optical and have their eye examination at a cost of \$50.

No surgery financial assistance is being provided at the present time, but may be considered in the future after discussions with Summa and also after the health care reforms now being considered the US Congress are concluded.

Many Thanks to the Lions Shirley Frazier, Freda and Aldon Smyth, Roy Morrow, James Van Gilder, Ida Van Guilder, Bill Hixon, and DG Grant Frazier for their wonderful hospitality and excellent dinner.

The next GALEP board meeting is scheduled for August 2, which is the GALEP annual picnic meeting at the Tallmadge Lions Hall. All attending are expected to bring a covered dish.

These funds will be used to meet the increased eyeglass needs of those who would otherwise not have access to such care.
