Get Ready...Get set...Get going...more information is forthcoming.

The Lions Club International Multiple District 13 are out for blood, and aren't afraid to ask for the lion's share from members of the local community.

Joining forces with the American Red Cross, the Lions have launched the "Lion's Share of Life" program, and committed to increasing blood donations at Red Cross blood drives held at churches, club halls, schools and community centers. And they'll do it through a time-tested recruitment effort: by simply

asking others to roll up their sleeves and give the gift of life.

"Lions Club members will receive recruitment cards to pass out to family and friends, asking them to donate blood," says Governor Marty for the Cleveland-Akron Chapters of the American Red Cross. "Sometimes, all it takes is that face-to-face ask to encourage someone to roll up their sleeve and help save a life."

"We're pleased to have such great ambassadors as the Lions on board to help with blood donation efforts," says Governor Marty. "Their assistance will be invaluable as we work to ensure hospital patients have the blood they need when they need it."

Everyday, hospital patients need blood for the treatment of cancer and other serious diseases, for scheduled or unexpected surgeries, or for emergency care related to accidents and trauma. One out of 10 people admitted to the hospital needs blood.

The stability of the nation's blood supply relies on healthy, volunteer blood donors who give generously for others in need. In Cleveland-Akron, the Red Cross must collect a large number of pints of blood each day to meet the needs of patients in all area hospitals.

The "Lions Share of Life" program is part of an international partnership between Lions Club International and the International Red Cross Red Crescent Society to support humanitarian efforts world-wide.

Remember their motto... "The need is constant. The gratification is instant. Give blood"

During my visitations throughout the district we will be trying to get your club to join in this endeavor. As a district I believe we can make a huge difference. Join me in this quest to help those who cannot help themselves! I am looking forward to visiting you all soon.

GALEP Report

GALEP ACTIVITIES

Since January 1, 2010, Galep has approved 60 applications and paid for 33 prescription eyeglasses and 7 eye examinations. Since its reorganization GALEP has approved over 120 applications. GALEP has \$108,639 at July 31, 2010.

The revised Code of Regulations and Bylaws was mailed to all Board members in July will be discussed at the October 4th board meeting.

It is the policy of GALEP to pay for eye exams for children which cost \$30. Adults are referred to Summa for eye exams or if the applicant prefers, they may go to Dr. Thomas Adams of Osman Optical and have their eye examination at a cost of \$50.

No surgery financial assistance is being provided at the present time, but may be considered in the future after discussions with Summa and also after the health care reforms now being considered the US Congress are concluded.

The next board meeting of the GALEP Directors is scheduled for October 4, 2010.

The Lions Eye Clinic held its Board and meeting in September and discussed the following:

Annual Dinner/Fund Raiser - annual dinner to be held November 12 at the Slovenian Hall, Euclid, Ohio. Tickets are still available. Please call 216-363-2500 to request tickets.

Investments – the investment in equity mutual funds (corporate stocks) has been transferred to debt security mutual funds (bonds) to minimize risk of loss. The program's investments have returned to pre-2009 values with no loss to the Lions Eye Clinic.

Patient Services – a meeting took place August 18 with executives of St Vincent Outpatient managers, Geauga Vision, and Lions Eye Program officers. This meeting was intended to address a number of complaints concerning treatment of Lions applicants who have had unpleasant experiences at the Lions Eye Clinic. The need for an optician on a regular basis was discussed and Geauga Vision has agreed to have an Optician on hand from 10-4 daily.

Co-pay – a discussion was held concerning assessing a \$10 payment by all “walk-in” patients requesting Lions assistance with prescription eyeglasses in order to give the applicants for Lions eyeglasses a sense of ownership and ultimately responsibility in the care of their glasses as well as to eliminate the attitude of many recipients of Lions assistance that the services and eyeglasses received from Lions are “free” and promote the awareness that the services provided by the Lions is the result of the hard work of the 1,100 Lions of District 13-C who provide the funding for the Lions Eye Clinic at St. Vincent Medical Center. The Board approved a motion to present the co-pay proposal to the Delegates at the September 20th meeting.

40th Anniversary Pin – Discussion was held concerning design of a pin for the Lions Eye Clinic which would celebrate the 40th anniversary of

the Lions Eye Clinic and also to replace the rockers now awarded to clubs donating \$1,000 or more to the Lions Eye Clinic through the Parade of Checks. It was decided to design a pin which promoted the Lions Eye Clinic rather than any individual. The proposal will be presented to the Delegates at the Delegate meeting September 20th.

Election of Officers – the terms of President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, and Treasurer expire June 30, 2011 and PDG Grant Frazier has agreed to chair a committee to present a slate of candidates at the January Board meeting. Anyone interested in holding a position on the Board of Directors or serving as President, VP, Secretary, or Treasurer should contact PDG Grant at 1-330-794-8606. Anyone wishing to serve as President or Vice President must have served as a Director, Treasurer, or Secretary for a least one year.

Volunteers – the program is looking for volunteers to answer phones, respond to answer machine messages, and box used eyeglasses. Anyone interested may call 216-363-2500 or contact Lion Neil Sheeley, Andy Kolbus, Pam Abrams, or PDG Grant Frazier.

Like me, I'm sure that you have been following the news reports of the deadly flooding in Pakistan. My heart goes out to the 20 million affected by this disaster. As the flood waters

and death toll continue to rise, Lions are committed to helping.



Lions have been providing assistance since the devastating flooding began July 22, and [LCIF is providing US\\$120,000](#) to help Lions in providing relief to their communities.

You know well that Lions Clubs greatest asset is our volunteers - you and 1.35 million Lions around the world. Wherever there is a need, there is a Lions club nearby, ready to respond with their hearts and hands. In the case of disasters, we are the first to offer help, and the last to leave.

I was moved by a [video](#) the Lions in Pakistan created. While it shows the effects of the disaster, it also shows hope - hope for brighter days ahead. This hope is because of Lions. They have put aside their own needs to help their neighbors, providing needed relief supplies and shelter.

We have received a lot of inquiries from Lions asking how they can help. Lions in Norway have donated US\$81,000, District 105-I, Ireland, has donated US\$6,500, three clubs in District 201-W1, Australia, have donated a total of \$2,200, and Lions in England

have informed me they are sending funds to LCIF in support of this disaster. You can also give hope through a [designated donation to LCIF](#) for Pakistan relief.

We are truly committed to long-term relief, and [Haiti](#) is one example where our work remains ongoing. The Lions of Haiti have done a great job given the wide-spread devastation and the local constraints that exist.



Six hundred Haitian families will move into new homes thanks to an initiative between LCIF, the Lions of MD 111 Germany, and HELP, an international non-governmental organization (NGO). This is the first of many [reconstruction projects](#) to receive support from LCIF thanks to the generous response from the international family of Lions following the devastating earthquake in Haiti.

Through the project, homes will be erected directly on a family's plot of land, thus avoiding the hardship of further displacement and any potential property disputes. The building of these homes is an important first step toward reestablishing normal life for families who lost their homes and so much more after the earthquake.

From Haiti to Pakistan, China to Tennessee, Lions and our foundation are rebuilding homes and lives.
